Socios Collaborative
Regional Level
 The Socios Collaborative bring together representatives from many of the participating organizations. This group helps provide support and guidance to Poder Popular as well as working to impact public policy at a regional level.

CONCILIO
Town Level
 Asamblea members come together with representatives of various sectors - education, government, business, growers, health care, religious institutions and others - to develop and implement a health action plan .

ASAMBLEAS
United Town Resident Body
 Representatives from each of the community organizations come together to enhance their leadership skills and prepare for active participation in the concilios. Asambleas form the basis for the resident input into the Poder process and provide an opportunity to strengthen the farm worker voice.

COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS
Resident Groups
 Community groups send leaders from their organization to participate in the asambleas. These groups consist of both regional organizations with local chapters and others which exist solely in the specific community.
