

#### **ESTIMATED GRANT ALLOCATION BY PROGRAM AREA**



Minor revisions to funding priorities



CHILDREN & YOUTH DEVELOPMENT: We support programs that help children and youth reach their full potential.

 Integrated academic supports to help youth (grades k-12) make on-grade progression and be prepared for success (e.g., tutoring and homework support, in-school supplemental programs, academic mentors, college preparation)



HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES: We invest in prevention and early intervention services\* that improve the physical and mental health of individuals and families, support programs that promote independent living and efforts that ensure that the basic living needs of Monterey County's most vulnerable and underserved individuals and families are met.

Basic needs services to meet growing trends or changing issues. Funding will focus on services that address basic living needs (food and shelter) of Monterey County's most vulnerable individuals and families (e.g., adding services or hours of service, or implementing new business practices that contribute to improved client outcomes)

Minor revisions to funding priorities



ARTS & CULTURE: We foster activities and programs that broaden and deepen participation in quality artistic experiences, especially among youth, diverse communities and other new audiences.

#### **Funding Priorities:**

- Access to art education and cultural experiences that nurture development for youth (e.g., art appreciation programs, youth mentorship, artistic training and performance opportunities)
- Relevant, high-quality, artistic experiences (e.g., targeted marketing and outreach efforts, strategic initiatives for audience development, programming to attract new audiences, development of multi-cultural programs)



ENVIRONMENT & ANIMAL WELFARE: We support programs that educate and involve local residents in protecting and preserving our natural resources and sustaining healthy ecosystems; and we invest in animal welfare programs that promote the responsible and humane treatment of companion animals.

- Programs that address pet overpopulation, abuse, neglect and homelessness
- Programs that support keeping companion animals at home

Grant agreement process

#### GRANT AGREEMENT

A grant from the Community Foundation for Monterey County (CFMC) is to be used only for the purposes described herein and is subject to the grantee's acceptance of the conditions specified below. Reviewing the grant agreement now will expedite payment IF a grant is approved.

Grant Period: 11-month grant, July 1 - May 31

Final Report Due: May 31, 2020

**Purpose and Use of Funds**: Grant funds must be spent within **11** months of the grant date and for the purposes stated in the grant proposal and specified above. Grant funds may not be used for any expenses incurred prior to the grant date.


