- Granted more than \$2.1 million to support the future of girls and women's economic opportunity

- Created GHGH Scholarships, awarding nearly \$300,000 in scholarships thanks to Women's Fund donors
- Launched the Women's Economic Security Initiative to help women and their children move out of poverty
- Commissioned and funded The Lives of Women & Girls Status Report
- Developed the Women's Business Education and Loan Program in partnership with the El Pajaro Community Development Corporation
- Established the first micro-loan fund for women in Monterey County with 1st Capital Bank

### Why Invest in Women & Girls?

#### **Economic Self-Sufficiency**

Too many women and girls in Monterey County are without the means to support themselves and their families.

#### Education

Education is key to breaking the cycle of poverty, but low-income women face serious obstacles to realizing their educational goals.

#### Health

Serious health disparities persist along socioeconomic and demographic lines.

#### Safety

Women of all ages are vulnerable to violence, harassment and bullying, and do not feel empowered to speak out and seek assistance.

■ More than 1 in 6 Monterey County Girls drop out of high school.

Fewer than one-third of girls who graduate from high school pursue a higher education.

Two-thirds of women who work fulltime earn less than \$50,000 per year.

Two-thirds of working women can't afford quality child care.

■ 25% of adult women have **no** health insurance coverage.
